



MEMBER NEWS - TALES FROM THE TEXAS PACIFIC LINES by MIKE ARNOLD

COLORADO COUNTY RICE MILL SILOS AT EAGLE LAKE, TX

My railroad was planned around Rosenberg TX as it was a location where two major street view. The main line runs along in front with one single industry track running railroads, originally SP and Santa Fe and now UP and BNSF, met and crossed, with a off the main from the right behind the block of nine silos two deep to the right and small yard between them. There were locals on both roads out of Houston to serve in front of the larger block of silos on the left. By the way there is another block of the industries in Rosenberg. Thus two major switching operations were born and are nine silos four deep behind those on the right. There are drying houses off to the left a regular feature of operating the Texas Pacific Lines. That was until I discovered of the photo grab. The plant is served by covered hoppers. that UP gave up the Rosenberg local to KCS but....

On YouTube I discovered that UP runs an Eagle Lake local - Eagle Lake is the next large township west of Rosenberg. It has a yard and a wye plus two long branch lines that leave the main line to serve an assortment of industries. One serves A&K Railroad Materials Inc (ties, track parts etc) and another on a redundant local line used to serve Eagle Lake Rice Dryer Inc - the rail connection has been removed. There is also one ricer dryer on the main line still served by rail, Colorado County Rice Mill Inc.

Having aborted the plan to have a higher level on the layout I had the space in the bottom right corner of the layout to introduce two more industries and add to the burden of the crew running the UP local. Below is the view of the mill from Google



The start was made а few months ago to alter the track layout in that corner of the layout to accommodate an extension of the loop from Rosenberg Produce Center linking up with the former turnout to lead to the abort-

ed upper deck. In between a run round cross over and additional loop was installed plus a trailing siding/spur into A&K Railroad Materials and a facing siding/spur alonmg the side wall of the cabin for Colorado County Rice Mills Inc. That was all tested and a dry run with a train was made to ensure it all worked, both electrically and logistically. Tick. Tick.

It took a while before structures were added as I had planned originally to use down pipe material for the silos but the purchase of a Walthers silo kit changed all that.

My rendition of the silos is somewhat more compact, just a representation. I had two materials sources for this project, a Walthers

grain silo kit with head house and end loading cabin and some assembled low relief industrial buildings from Pikestuff kits that had been given to me by the late Tony Harris when he ripped out his loft layout before moving to an apartment.

I started by cutting down the low relief structure using the guidelines on the reverse side to create the shed like structure that sits atop the silos and houses all the elevator equipment - the modern (ish) version of the head house. Fortunately it was exactly the length that I needed to sit on top of the silos in the space available.

New roofing material was taken from a kit in stock and six panels were glued in place in sequence with strengthened under neath at each joint. As you can see from the photo of the real thing there are a number of vents along the roof line. Fortunately I had a large number of these in my stock of kits and bits.

Space would only allow a single row of silos and not two deep as in the kit (and the real thing). The silos were assembled semi-low relief in that I used one complete side and coupled them with half a complete side to make a total of six silos wide (with open backs - you cannot see that!). Bases and tops were cut to fit - the ribs on the tops to locate the head house were not a problem as they would be hidden by the Pikestuff assembly. This would fit perfectly even with the end loading structure added at the right hand end against the cabin wall.

Although not finished yet, I have used the remaining parts of silo towers to represent in VERY low relief the silos beyond the tracks. Another part of Tony Harris's Pikestuff structures adds to the industrial back drop. All need to be painted some time.

So Eagle Lake TX now features in the operation of the Texas Pacific Lines with covered hoppers empty to Eagle Lake and loaded with rice for the return journey to Houston. A&K needs hoppers for ties and flat cars for track parts. Only a few cars at a time are shipped because spur length and run round impose a limit with fouling the main! And that would be a cardinal sin! For turning, there is the adjacent Y which there is at Eagle Lake TX. So very prototypical, if somewhat compressed.





MEMBER NEWS - WANTED, A NEW HOME FOR FLORENCE, IOWA, ROCK ISLAND



B UNITS

Some B units are built that way - see the GE B30-7As and EMD GP60Bs - but others get converted to B Unit status, either in looks or in terms of control. Here we start with the GEs: BN 4045 in a manifest freight at Caliente CA in the Tehachapis in 1998 and BN 4064 at the same location. Niote #4064 is of the later build with brake housing prominent (there is a kit for this!)






FROM THE CABOOSE - Mike Arnold

I have no idea where the last two months have gone, but gone they have!

A trip over to St Osyth last month for the physical meet proved both productive and frustrating. Productive in that my extra module for the end of Laxton was an electrical success - Mike Meadows would have signed it off had he still been a member. It was made from a spare board that doubled as a step at our kitchen door when we hosted tea parties for older folk. We have a proper concrete and brick one now - and we have stopped doing the tea parties! I have spent a good few happy hours since applying ballast, ground cover and general scenic effects. As I write it is almost ready and just needs a lick of black paint on the baseboard sides. As it will double as a Freemo board there is no backscene.

Frustrating on two fronts: the mystery of the whereabouts of the craftsman kitbuilt Peach Meadows passenger depot building continues as it was not amongst the buildings Paul Harman found in his loft. Nonetheless the new replacement building has been put in nicely. The other frustration was that my train of autoracks kept uncoupling and parting company - some even decided that the ballast looked better to run on. For me the day was a joy and made the two hour drive each way a pleasurable journey.

Back to that extra board. Although the original offer to provide a run round lead for Laxton ad implicitly just some plain straight track, it did not end up that way. The board itself was a rectangle, 16" by 23.5". As I could not decide which way round would be best I decided to run two tracks across each other and thus. foolishly, to scratch-build a 90 degree crossing to accommodate that. I had a drawing from Real Tracks website so I set about it. The objective was to scratch-build another piece of trackwork for Civil Engineer in the Achievement Program. It just needs to work in both directions - no scores, no beauty parade with scenery etc. I tried it with a Bachmann pannier tank



and hey presto. I just now need to video it operating to show it works for the sign off by Keith Webb or one of his assessors. Foolish? In hindsight no as it certainly ticked a box for AP. IO would also add that it was a learning curve for me to solder it together from PCB ties and rail pieces cut, bent and filed to shape. Do you know how many pieces of rail there are in it? And by the way the lower track was only tacked in place! It does line up now.

Having done all the scenic work on that small module I now realise how much work there is still to do on the layout - more than half has no scenery at all and ballasting will take an age. The issue I have is matching the ground cover as my supply of silver sand is running out and getting a colour match will be a gamble to say the least. I have plenty of ballast in SP colours - a blend of greys and cinders, all by Arizona Rock & Mineral. In fact I was surprised how many bags I must have brought back from the USA as it is not available here in the UK. In fact I am not sure it is still available over there as the family run business, a real aggregates company, was wanting to sell on and the owners retire. And if I have one pack of grass in fine or medium or tufts I have dozens of them. I do not need any tufts. I used to buy them whenever I saw them but COVID and lockdown taught me a lesson - do not buy scenic materials! Rainy day never comes does it.

Planning for my trip to the Texas Convention continues - checking out Amtrak videos on YouTube and the rail cams at St Louis, Big Sandy TX and Forth Worth Tower 55 to see what the consist is. By the way Tower 55 is no longer there as it was demolished in November last year but the location is still as busy as ever. We should be in for a great time there on those days we get out trackside or take the local passenger trains.

The Open Day beckons - let us hope all our stock is on its best behaviour and the layouts all go together in good time on Friday evening. See you all there at 6.00pm. Come equipped with tools and soldering irons etc




